LOWER LEA INQUIRY SCHEDULED

A public inquiry into three Compulsory Purchase Orders and a road closure order made by the London Docklands Development Corporation (LDDC) for land assembly for redevelopment and the proposed Lower Lea Crossing highway scheme is scheduled to begin at 10 am, on Tuesday 5 July 1988.

The inquiry will be held into the following orders: London Docklands Development Corporation (Lower Lea Crossing, Tower Hamlet and Newham) Compulsory Purchase Order 1987; London Docklands Development Corporation (Lower Lea Crossing, Newham) (No 2) Compulsory Purchase Order 1987; London Docklands Development Corporation (Lower Lea Crossing, Tower Hamlets and Newham) (No 3) Compulsory Purchase Order 1988 and The Draft Lower Lea Crossing Road Scheme (London Boroughs of Newham and Tower Hamlets) (Stopping Up Order 1988).

The inquiry, which is expected to last three weeks, will be held at LDDC's Thames House, Gate 14, Woolwich Manor Way, London E16, commencing at 10 am on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of each week, in front of the Inspector, Mr P J Leveridge C Eng. FICE Dip TE.

Notes to Editors

The proposed Lower Lea Crossing is a dual two lane road approximately 1 km long connecting a new roundabout at Leamouth Road, in the former East India Docks, to a new roundabout underneath Silvertown Way Viaduct. The road will incorporate a high level crossing of the River Lea to allow shipping movements. Local access to existing and new developments will be located on either side of the river. The Lower Lea Crossing is one of a number of highway schemes, being progressed by the Corporation, which are now in various stages of preparation and/or construction.
